A. COURSE OBJECTIVE

A1. GENERAL COURSE OBJECTIVE:

Through this course students will improve their communication ability in writing as well as orally.

The course focuses on grammar, pronunciation, conversation and reading comprehension.

A2. SPECIFIC COURSE OBJECTIVES

Student will get by in social situations corresponding to an A2 level. Students will learn to:

Use everyday formal expressions. Know how to get by in brief social exchanges.
 Discuss practical matters of daily life. Describe present or past personal experiences. Describe objects and places.

Throughout the course students will acquire a communicative competency according to their level, in writing as well as orally in order to:

- Interact in daily information exchange activities
- Talk about their personal life and that of those around them, their life styles, their work etc.
- Describe experiences and facts in the past, in a simple way.
- Understand everything related to topics of personal interest.
- Grasp the main idea of simple texts and messages.
- Understand written texts and find specific information.
- Write brief texts referring to their personal environment.
- Write personal letters about their needs.

B. COURSE PLAN

1. Topic 1

✓ Grammatical Content

Contrasts between Ser and Estar. Person Direct Object. Some verbs with prepositions (a, de, en ...)

✓ Functional Content

Identify, define and describe places, people and objects. Locate people, objects and places. Make excuses and talk on the telephone.





✓ Lexical Content

Social relationships. Vocabulary related to physical appearance

✓ Cultural Content

Fashion in Spain

2. Topic 2

✓ Grammatical Content

Indefinite regular and irregular preterit and uses. Time markers. Volver a + infinitive.

✓ Functional Content

Talk about actions in the past.

✓ Lexical Content

Travels and holidays.

✓ Cultural Content

Immigration in Spain. Tourism.

3. Topic 3

√ Grammatical Content

Perfect preterit in Spain and Latin-America. Time markers. Undefined adjectives and pronouns. Indirect objects. Double construction: direct/indirect object.

✓ Functional Content

Narrate actions in the past. Describe personal situations, talk about the frequency of an action. Describe or narrate actions in the past.

✓ Lexical Content

Personal leisure and free time experiences.

✓ Cultural Content

Biographies: Cervantes and Picasso.

4. Topic 4





✓ Grammatical Content

Indefinite Preterit: irregular forms. Time markers: al cabo de/ a los/ después de. Contrast perfect preterit/ indefinite preterit.

✓ Functional Content

Talk about historic facts. Talk about the time that separates two actions in the past. Ask and give information about a resume. Tell anecdotes.

✓ Lexical Content

Historical facts and resumes.

✓ Cultural Content

Contemporary Spanish History: The Spanish Civil War.

5. Topic 5

✓ Grammatical Content

¡Qué + noun+ tan/más + adjective! Shortened form of the adjectives; bueno, malo, primero, tercero, grande. Comparatives, superlatives. Indirect style.

✓ Functional Content

Excuse yourself, express disappointment. Feel sorry for yourself, express surprise, enthusiasm and boredom. Give information. Express obligation.

✓ Lexical Content

Social events: weddings.

✓ Cultural Content

A wedding ceremony in Spain. Gypsies in Spain: gypsy weddings.

6. Topic 6

✓ Grammatical Content

Imperfect preterit: how to form it and uses. Contrast present/imperfect preterit. Time markers: antes/ahora. Soler+ infinitive. Adverbs and expressions of frequency.





✓ Functional Content

Descriptions and habits in the past. Description of animals and people in the past. Talk about circumstances in which an event took place.

✓ Lexical Content

Domestic work. School.

✓ Cultural Content

The Education System in Spain.

7. Topic 7

✓ Grammatical Content

Contrast of past tenses. Antes de /hace/desde hace/ verb durar/durante.

✓ Functional Content

Talk about the duration on an action in the past.

✓ Lexical Content

History.

✓ Cultural Content

Contemporary History in Spain. The Spanish dictatorship and the transition to democracy.

8. Topic 8

✓ Grammatical Content

Imperfect future. Expressions of future tense. Si +present indicative+ future imperfect. Es que...

✓ Functional Content

Make conjectures. Talk about something without being specific, make promises, and talk about future actions that depend on a condition. Make predictions.

✓ Lexical Content

Advertising.





✓ Cultural Content

Television and radio in Spain.

9. Topic 9

✓ Grammatical Content

Simple conditional: how to form it and uses.

✓ Functional Content

Make conjectures in the past. Suggestions and advice. References to the future related to the past. Express politeness.

✓ Lexical Content

Pharmacy and medical consultation.

✓ Cultural Content

The Spanish Social Security System.

10. Topic 10

✓ Grammatical Content

Imperative. Present subjunctive. Introduction to the uses of the subjunctive.

√ Functional Content

Ask and give permission. Express prohibition, recommendations or advise. Invite or offer.

✓ Lexical Content

Family life: norms of living together.

✓ Cultural Content

Flamenco.

C. CLASS RULES

- Class attendance is mandatory. More than two unjustified absences will result in a penalization of 10% of the final grade.

E. COMPOSITIONS AND PRESENTATIONS

To calculate the final grade the professor will apply the following guidelines:

✓ Compositions

Students will write three compositions throughout each course sequence. The content (information, originality and depth) will be taken into account as well as written expression (agreement, conjugation, vocabulary, logical sentence order) and presentation. The composition grade will be lowered if students have written below the number of words required.

Intercambio composition topics

Each composition must be 200-250 words long, typed in Arial Font size 12 and doubled spaced.

- 1. Spanish fashion shops.
- 2. Your future plans.
- 3. An anecdote from the past.

√ Homework and Participation

The student will have to work on the assigned tasks by the professor at home as the following day they will be corrected in class.

✓ Oral Presentation

Each student will work on one of the topics proposed by the professor; each student will do a presentation in Spanish to the rest of the class. The student may use any material that makes the presentation clear

Students may not read directly from a text; however they may use index cards or notes which help them remember the content of the presentation.





As in the case of the compositions, the content, oral expression, pronunciation, vocabulary, clarity of ideas and grammar will all be evaluated positively.

The presentation will be approximately 5 minutes long.
