A. COURSE OBJECTIVE

A1. GENERAL COURSE OBJECTIVE

In this course students will improve their communication in writing as well as orally to get by in a Hispanic environment.

This course focuses on grammar, pronunciation, conversation and reading comprehension.

A2. SPECIFIC COURSE OBJECTIVES

Students are capable of interacting in a variety of situations and know how to deal with everyday places. Students learn to:

Understand the main ideas of extensive debates in Standard Spanish. Give and ask personal opinions in an informal debate. Take initiative, make a complaint, ask for clarification, give detailed instructions as to how to do something, summarize and respond in detail to questions.

Throughout the course students will acquire a communicative competence according to their level, in writing as well as orally in order to:

- Describe and narrate experiences, facts, stories and tales simply.
- Express their own wishes and make conjectures about the reality which surrounds them. Justify opinions and propose plans.
- Interact with native speakers in daily life situations.
- Participate in conversations about topics of personal interest.
- Understand the description of events, feelings and wishes in personal letters.
- Understand the general idea of radio and television programs which cover current affairs.
- Write personal texts that describe experiences and impressions.

C. CLASS RULES

E. COMPOSITIONS AND ORAL PRESENTATION

To calculate the final grade the professor will apply the following guideline:

✓ Compositions

Students will write three compositions throughout each course sequence. The content (information, originality and depth) will be taken into account as well as written expression (agreement, conjugation, vocabulary, logical sentence order) and presentation. The composition grade will be lowered if students have written below the number of words required.

✓ Homework and Participation

The student will have to work on the assigned tasks by the professor at home as the following day they will be corrected in class.

✓ Oral Presentation

Each student will work on one of the topics proposed by the professor; each student will do a presentation in Spanish to the rest of the class. The student may use any material that makes the presentation clear.





Students may not read directly from a text, however they may use index cards or notes which help them remember the content of the presentation.

As in the case of the compositions, the content, oral expression, pronunciation, vocabulary, clarity of ideas and grammar will all be evaluated positively.

The presentation will be approximately 10 minutes long.
